The Western Michigan basketball team has enjoyed its most successful stretch in school history with head coach Steve Hawkins leading the way. The Broncos have won 20 or more games in three of his six seasons and have won or finished second in the Mid-American Conference West Division every year, with division championships coming in 2003-04, 2004-05, 2007-08 and 2008-09.

The Broncos won the MAC regular season and tournament championship in 2004 to advance to the NCAA Tournament. They followed with an appearance in the Postseason NIT in 2005.

Over the past seven seasons, WMU ranks among the best teams in the MAC with 126 overall wins and 74 conference victories.

The Broncos have also been dominant in the state, winning the Michigan MAC Men's Basketball Championship all four years of its existence, going a combined 12-4 vs. their instate conference rivals.


#### WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY VOLLEYBALL STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING PHILOSOPHY

The Western Michigan University Basketball Strength and Conditioning Program is a year round effort to maintain a championship level of strength, power, speed and conditioning. The program is built to help each athlete play at their optimal level during practice and games, stay healthy and improve performance by incorporating explosiveness and intensity in each workout. Using a combination of Olympic exercises, functional training and basketball-specific speed and agility training, each Bronco Basketball athlete will be physically ready to make that championship run.











#### **WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC TRAINING**

The focus of the WMU athletic training staff is to prevent studentathlete injuries and facilitate an effective post-injury rehabilitation to ensure a safe return to competition.

Five full-time athletic trainers oversee three graduate athletic trainers in providing comprehensive medical care to all of Western Michigan's 16 varsity sports. In addition to its eight-person athletic training staff, the WMU athletic training staff is assisted by three full-time physicians and a sports medicine fellow.



The Western Michigan basketball experience features travel on not just a national, but global scale.


In the summer of 2006, the Broncos went overseas to visit Rome, Italy, and Athens, Greece. Four years prior, the Broncos visited France and Switzerland.

Western Michigan also has traveled throughout the United States to find the best competition. The Bronco Experience is about more than just basketball, as Hawkins and his staff make sure the Broncos visit some of the most important historical sites and fun places in the United States.

In Hawkins' six years as head coach, the Broncos have visited Honolulu, Los Angeles, Orlando, Philadelphia, Alaska, San Diego, New York City, Las Vegas, the United States Military Academy and Niagara Falls, among others. This year, WMU will travel to Hawai'i for the second time in program history.

On those trips, the Broncos have visited Pearl Harbor, the Liberty Bell, Times Square, Universal Studios and Disney World.




















The court is not the only arena Western Michigan basketball has shown rising success during head coach Steve Hawkins' tenure. The Broncos are getting it done in the classroom as well. Over the past three years WMU basketball student-athletes have posted a 3.0 GPA or higher in four-straight semesters and five of the last six. Hawkins' attention to detail in all areas of the student-athletes' experience has helped the program's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score, resulting in recognition from the NCAA during the 2006-07 season as being ranked in the top-10 percent of all Division I men's basketball programs.



This past season, guard David Kool was named to the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-America Team after center Joe Reitz became a two-time ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American the prior two seasons after finishing his career with a 3.72 grade point average and a degree in finance. Reitz became the third two-time Academic All-American in WMU history and just the seventh in MAC history. The Broncos lead the MAC in multiple men's basketball Academic All-Americans with three. Three straight years with an Academic All-American has only happened three times in conference history and WMU's accomplishment is the first time since 1991-93.





Not only have the Broncos been recognized on a national scale, but no other school in the MAC has been more successful in the classroom over Steve Hawkins' six-year tenure as head coach. Over that span, WMU has claimed 12 Academic All-MAC spots, including 10-of-21 over the last four seasons. Brian Snider, Joe Reitz and Andrew Hershberger have all been three-time Academic All-MAC picks under Hawkins.


## GARY FUND



GARY FUND EXCEEDS \$1 MILLION FOR SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR Gary Fund had another record-setting year with an overall goal of \$1.0 million for the 2009 campaign.

The Mike Gary Athletic Fund announced a two percent increase in donations with a total of \$1,022,045. Last year's record total was \$1,002,749. The Gary Fund volunteers surpassed their calling period goal of \$475,000 with a total of \$477,962.

The announcement was made at the Mike Gary Athletic Fund Celebration held at the Gilmore House hosted by Dr. and Mrs. Dunn. In attendance were the Gary Fund volunteers, the WMU Head Coaches and athletic staff.

The WMU student-athletes and teams are grateful to the Gary Fund donors and the volunteers.






Western Michigan basketball is a staple on television during hoops season. In Hawkins' six years as head coach, the Broncos have been featured on regional or national television 52 times. The lights have shown brightest over the past few years as the Broncos have been on national TV eight times over the last three seasons. In 2007-08, the Broncos hosted **ESPNU** at University Arena for wins over Central Michigan and Eastern Michigan, marking the first national TV broadcast to originate from Kalamazoo since 2004. During the 2006-07 season, the Broncos were featured in primetime on ESPN2 on Thanksgiving Day in a 71-68 victory over Virginia Tech, a team that reached the second round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament.


# GETTING NOTICED

"Success is all about being at peace with yourself. The only way to attain that is through your best effort. After all, what more can you give than your all?"


